

PASTORAL COLUMN

Jesus has been teaching his disciples as they walk from town to town, everything he does or says to them has a particular message to impart. A couple of weeks ago, Jesus asked his disciples a very pointed question, 'Who do you say that I am?' Peter tells him, 'You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God.' It is at this very time, that Jesus lets Peter and the rest of the disciples know that he has chosen Peter to lead the disciple's after he ascends to Heaven. He says, 'You are Peter and upon this rock, I will build my church.'

Last week, Jesus continues his lessons by telling his disciples that he will suffer greatly by the chief priests and scribes, and will be killed but raised from the dead in three days. This lesson was intended to show that all of us are subject to being wrong in our ideas or our interpretations. He again uses Peter to explain this. He tells Peter that he is thinking not as God does but as human beings do.

This week he is teaching about judging others and correcting wrongs. We, as humans, are subject to wrong thinking and needing others to show us the right way. Again he tells the disciples that Peter has the authority and leadership after Jesus ascends to heaven. Today's message is given to Peter but also the other disciples when he says, 'Whatever you bind on earth is bound in heaven, and whatever to loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.

The point of these lessons is to show that Jesus has the authority to teach and do these things and to convey that authority to others. Jesus tells us all in Mt 18:20, 'For wherever two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them.

Continue being people of faith and be able to hear the lessons given to us all. Jesus has the words of everlasting life. ~Deacon Chuck

Jesús ha estado enseñando a sus discípulos mientras caminan de pueblo en pueblo, todo lo que hace o les dice tiene un mensaje particular que impartir. Hace un par de semanas, Jesús hizo a sus discípulos una pregunta muy directa: "¿Quién decís que soy yo?" Pedro le dice: "Tú eres el Cristo, el Hijo del Dios viviente". Es en este mismo momento, que Jesús le hace saber a Pedro y al resto de los discípulos que él ha elegido a Pedro para guiar al discípulo después de que ascienda al Cielo. Él dice: 'Tú eres Pedro y sobre esta roca, edificaré mi iglesia'.

La semana pasada, Jesús continúa sus lecciones diciéndoles a sus discípulos que sufrirá mucho por los principales sacerdotes y escribas, y será asesinado pero resucitado de entre los muertos en tres días. Esta lección tenía la intención de mostrar que todos nosotros estamos sujetos a estar equivocados en nuestras ideas o nuestras interpretaciones. De nuevo usa a Pedro para explicar esto. Le dice a Pedro que no está pensando como Dios lo hace, sino como lo hacen los seres humanos.
